PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Spring is officially here — and the serious season of outside rockhounding beckons. Hurray! I have just returned from the annual Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies (RMFMS) convention as a delegate. These Federation meetings (held this year in conjunction with and by organization of the Alb., NM club show) followed an agenda of selection of new officers (for 2017-2018), discussions and voting of new and/or edited Operating Procedures, Bylaws review/adjustment, and plans going forward. The business meetings were preceded by an awards session concerning clubs websites, bulletins, etc., and followed by a closing banquet in which additional individual awards were made, and the oncoming officers were introduced/sworn in. As a part of the conference, two field trips were arranged for interested participants. Take aways from the conference include the recognition and awareness of activities, programs and lessons learned of other RMFMS clubs/members (primarily via the various award categories exercised, and networking), the energy and positive efforts of the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies (AFMS), RMFMS and clubs in advancing the interests, concerns and plans of our hobby focus. To that end, it has been determined that the next annual RMFMS convention will (negotiations are underway, and

need final confirmation) occur in June 2018 in conjunction with the "Cottontail" event in Fairplay, CO — this to be a consolidated sponsored/organized effort by the several Denver area clubs. For a 2019 convention it has been solicited by interested clubs for that session to occur in Rapid City, SD.

For general information (per the RMFMS Treasurer), the RMFMS consists of clubs in 13 states (AZ, AK, CO, KS, NE, NE, NM, ND, OK, SD, TX, UT, and WY); 78 clubs (up from 76 in 2016); and 10, 400 members (up from 9, 761 in 2016). Similarly RMFMS belongs to the AFMS which consists of 7 Federations (CA, Rocky Mountain, S. Central, SE, E. Midwestern, Midwest and NW).

Our KC March Show appeared to be a significant success based upon attendance and follow-on comments by vendors, etc. (Association final report is forthcoming). We thank all our club members who participated in the organization, set up and performance of the event, and feel we met and exceeded our anticipated responsibility/share of the effort on behalf of the Association. Also thank you to our club members who placed display cases in the show (which in addition to positively displaying interests and abilities of our members, also benefits the club financially via Association contribution). As a side note, I learned at the RMFMS convention that at least one RMFMS officer attended our show — to overwhelming positive observations.

On April 8 we will lead/participate in a field trip — that being a selenite crystal dig at the Salt Flats National Wildlife Refuge site near Jet, OK. I will separately poll members for interest/confirmation of intent to participate in this event. To date several (including some Topeka club members — and maybe a McPherson club

member) have indicated they will participate. Down the road, we will be invited by the Topeka club to join them in a visit to the Hutchison underground salt mines.

In May, in accordance with our Bylaws, we will hold nominations/elections for club officers for the 2017-2018 operating year. Individuals interested in serving and growing the club as an officer (or various committee positions) are encouraged to express their desire at this time.
