#### **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:**

Parkvilla northcutti??????? A rather recent fossil find at Park University (Parkville, MO) by Tim Northcutt has been identified by a KU paleobotanist as a previously unknown seed fern that is 306 million years old. The unique plant fossil, complete with finely detailed pollen organs and carbonization, has been formally named Parkvilla northcutti in honor of the person discovering it. An article concerning the find was published in the November 2016 Review of Paleobotany and Palynology (entitled A New Pennsylvanian Pollen Organ From Northwestern Missouri With Affinities in the Lyginopteridales). Also, an article concerning this find was in the KC Star on Thursday, July 20. Now, at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, July 25, 2017 at the National Archives (next to Union Station), there will be free forum discussing the fossil, and why such discoveries are important.
