More recently the club, as we know it today, began about Jan. 1996 (when Sig and Marilyn Ross moved here from San Jose, CA where they owned and operated a rock and gem shop for more than 40 years). The Shawnee Mission and Olathe split occurred sometime after the 1996 time frame. If someone has more specific information/dates please let me know.
