The Nov. club meeting saw great attendance and interest in gold panning of gravel/sand concentrate from of all places – Missouri!!!! Vince Martini led and instructed the session, explaining he collected the gold bearing concentrate from stream beds some distance North of KC. This material was transported into the area by past glacial activity and in addition to flour gold, several members found garnets and sapphires – and I also found a sharks tooth. Also in Nov., three of our members attended a four session cabbing class sponsored by the Independence Gem and Mineral Society (IGAM). The class, limited to 8 participants, was well done and clearly worthwhile. They (IGAM) intend to host the class again – probably 3-4 times in 2017.

The TGMS is a very active and well organized club, and their next show is already scheduled for Oct. 14-15, 2017. This is not the show our club is officially involved in (that being the March spring show), and some comments were received that this smaller fall show was "slow" – but at the same time reports were that vendors indicated that sales were up.
