Then on Sat., June 24 ten members individuals traveled to the Whetstine Rock Quarries at Troy, KS. Another good day in the field and lots of fossiliferous materials, pyrite, etc. were brought back. Concerning our T. rex presentation this past spring, I am getting reports from Dr. Burnham that they arrived at the dig site three weeks ago, and volunteers (even some whole families) are arriving weekly to help with the efforts. All seem to be having a positive experience — which apparently is helped by cooler temperatures so far this year. I believe the dig efforts this year will last another six or seven weeks, and we look forward to having a progress report this fall. Thanks are conveyed to all who contributed to the tax exempt support of this important dig.

Mike Purduski reminds us of the upcoming Aug. 17, 2017 total solar eclipse — which by chance will be most completely visible in a path (NW thru SE) in and near St. Joseph and surrounding communities (but, will be readily visible in KC, so no need to travel far to see it.) On line it is stated that St. Joseph "...is right on the centerline of the eclipse path and enjoys one of the longest durations in the nation." The peak eclipse time is 1:06 PM CDT. WARNING, WARNING, WARNING do not look directly at the eclipse — which would result in

severe eye/sight damage. Inexpensive solar glasses are available online (for as little as \$0.77) and there are some reports that WalMart is selling such glasses.
