INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION OF AGATE

The International Exposition of Agate was held in Austin, Texas June 6-9, 2019 and attracted over 200 participants. This premier four day event hosted 16 internationally acclaimed speakers/authors, 42 agate specific vendors and 24 museum quality special exhibits (see lists below). Attendees and speakers came from throughout the U.S. as well as from Britain, Germany, Russia, Australia, Mexico, Africa and South America. I typically attend these sessions (my fourth of the five that have produced), which occur every four years, as they are some of the most educational and informative mineralogical offerings available, and expose participants one-on-one to the leaders in the field. Interestingly OGMS member Josh Foster was also seen at this event. It is unknown at this time where the next agate conference will occur, but it is very worth while planning for and attending.
