This will also be rescheduled. Now, going forward, hopefully June will be more successful. M. John has worked to get the Mozarkite collecting trip in — and at present this is anticipated to occur Sunday, June 4. M. John will be communicating with the site owner and watching the weather — and will be issuing notification and instructions as these plans come together. Note that this is the day after our June 3 picnic — so it will be a club weekend if all comes together.

Club picnic (June 3, 2017) directions — Lone Elm Park; Olathe, KS. starting at 3 PM Sat., June 3. (food served about 4 PM). The park address is 21151 W. 167th St.— and for whatever use it would be, the telephone number is 913 971 8563 (which I assume is only the Park Commission office which most likely is not even open on weekends). There are two entry points into the park on 167th St. — the one to the picnic site is to the West (the East one is to soccer fields). The picnic shelter is large with nine 8-foot newly refurbished picnic tables, a huge fireplace, two BBQ fixtures, lights, an electrical service, water fountain, three port-a-potties (one handicapped), and plenty of space for games, etc. In case of bad weather the shelter is plenty large enough to take care of our function. Also we will have a silent auction event (proceeds to the club) as part of this picnic if you have anything you wish to enter. If so please copy and fill out the attached form for the silent auction.

Remember, the club provides the meat items, cooking/BBQ/charcoal, plates, utensils, drinks (alcoholic drinks are not permitted in the park), ice, and paper service, etc. Participants are asked to contact M. John Robinson and indicate the number of anticipated attendees, and side dishes/items they wish to bring ASAP. Presently we recognize about 50 persons intending to attend.

The picnic symbolically closes our club operating year (we function basically May to May — or with the summer recess Sept. to Sept.). This past year has seen significant activities including an up-tic on field trips/interest, membership growth, great relevant and diverse programs (including unusual in-door gold panning), cab classes (hosted by IGAMS), upgrading of our website, updating/posting club Bylaws, incorporation of liability documents, continued participation in the planning and execution of the annual March gem and mineral show, active membership/participation in the Greater Kansas City Association of Earth Science Clubs, and representation at the Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies (RMFMS) annual convention, among other items/events. Going forward, anticipation is that this level of interest and activity will maintain and increase. To that end, believing participation is the key to continued diverse involvement, growth and interest and in furthering the theme of the RMFMS for member clubs (the theme for 2017-2018 is T. E. A. M. S. — Teach, Encourage, Accommodate, Mentor, Support), hopefully we have the diversity and impetus within our membership to engage individuals in the various committees of the club, ultimately further energizing our activities and growth. Please, please, please consider

lending your enthusiasm and energy to the club on a committee. It would be great to have each manned by a Chair, and a back-up (and/or co-chair) to encourage the vitality of the club. (Committees include, but may not be limited to, Website, Bulletin, Membership, Program, Show/events, Field trips, Bylaws, Financial/audit, Representatives, Historian, Library).

Following the June picnic (and whatever field trips you can participate in), all have a safe and great summer recess. We look forward to seeing all at the Tuesday, Sept. 5, 2017 club meeting — again at the church as we have an agreement to continue in this space for the next year. Bring lots of rocks and reports of successful gem and mineral adventures. Watch for monthly Bulletins as to plans and events in the interim.
