OGMS Club Meetings

As noted in a recent email to all club members, we will once more have our normal meetings after the 14-month virus recess. This next meeting will occur where we have been meeting, that being in room 018 at Hope Chapel (formerly the Indian Creek Community Church) 12480 Black Bob Road, Olathe, KS. This will be on Thursday, May 6, 2021 at 6:45 – 8:45 pm. NOTE THE **THURSDAY** DATE RATHER THAN THE TUESDAYS WE HAD BEEN MEETING IN THE PAST, AND NOTE THE NEW TIME, **6:45 – 8:45 pm**. Our program will include a presentation about the Nevada opal limb cast collecting trip taken by four of our members last summer, a Larry Wells exhibit and discussion of a carved ivory piece, a demonstration on concave faceting, and resumption of the raffle. As refreshments will not be provided at this first meeting, those attending are urged to bring their own drinks and snacks if desired. We look forward to seeing all of our members once more after the long absence. Note that masking and social distancing will be practiced for this meeting while the county reviews and adjusts virus restrictions.

OGMS Board Meeting/Activities

In preparation for resumption of normal club activities, the OGMS Board met on April 21. OGMS Author/Explorer

In the May 2021 Rock & Gem magazine, an article by OGMS member Gary Monroe appears in which he describes "A Rookie Prospector's Tale" involving he and three other OGMS members (Barbara Crompton, Allison Betts and Mike Purduski) "Senior Adventure at Royal Peacock Opal Mines, Inc" in Nevada in Sept. 2020. The 23-hour 1,550-mile (each way) drive was accomplished in one day and was rewarded by a visit to and collecting at a premier opal site. Part of the adventure (in which all found opals, of which we expect to hear more of later), was accompanied by rental car misadventure which can be touted as a learning experience when planning for such a trip to a remote area. Rocky Mountain Federation News
