### FIELD TRIPS

Dr. David A Burnham a renowned Paleontologist at the University of Kansas's Biodiversity gave OGMS and KMPS group a tour of the KU Museum on September 20, 2018.

For those who signed up for Sunday, **October 28th** at KU Museum, due to unforeseen circumstances we will need to postpone for another date in the future. This date will be determine later. But, Sunday, October 28th from 1pm-3pm, KU Museum will be sponsoring a National Fossil Day ID day which Dr Burnham and other fossil experts will be on hand to ID any fossil you bring to this event.

Larry Wells is currently planning an outing to two more Whetstine quarries. First, **October 27**<sup>th</sup>, an active Whetstine quarry in Atchison, Kansas, which is very close to KC, closer than the Troy Kansas quarry. This will be a very convenient short trip.

Secondly, the Whetstine quarry in Nebraska City, Nebraska, **November 10<sup>th</sup>**, much further away, however possibly better glacial drift, etc. Larry said this quarry was just recently purchased by Mr. Whetstine. It is an old quarry that has not been worked for a long time. Mr. Whetstine told Larry it has several very large piles of old crushed rock sorted by various sizes and types that would be easy to explore. It is currently being made into an active working limestone quarry.


# **UPCOMING EVENTS**
