Program, NOV. 18, 2021 OGMS Meeting

We are pleased to announce that the program for November 18th will be by Dr. Rolfe Mandel, Director and State Geologist of the Kansas Geological Survey. His presentation will entail KS geological highlights, as well as Paleo Indians, of which he is a recognized expert having investigated among other locations the Spring Creek site in southwest Nebraska. Below is his bio -

ROLFE DAVID MANDEL

Research Centers - Anthropology, Kansas Geological Survey University Distinguished Professor

Senior Scientist, Geoarcheaology/Quaternary Geology Director and State Geologist, Kansas Geological Survey Executive Director, Odyssey Geoarchaeology Research, U. of KS

Expertise and Current Research Activity

Mandel's published works span a wide range of topics including paleopedology, late-Quaternary landscape evolution, isotope geochemistry, and paleoenvironmental reconstruction. He has spent over 30 years working with archaeologists on projects throughout the United States and eastern Mediterranean, focusing on the effects of geologic processes on the archaeological record. During the past 10 years much of his research has involved the use of geoscientific methods to search for the earliest evidence of humans in the Central Great Plains and Midwest. Dr. Mandel founded and chaired the Society for American Archaeology's Geoarchaeology Interest Group (1997-2001), served as Chair of the Geological Society of America's Archaeological Geology Division (1997-1998), and was President of the American Quaternary Association (2009-2010). In 2012 he was appointed Chair of the U.S. National Committee for Quaternary Research/INQUA. Presently he is an Associate Editor for Current Research in the Pleistocene, Geoarchaeology: An International Journal, and the Encyclopedia of Geoarchaeology. He has received many awards and distinctions, including Fellow of the Geological Society of America, the 2011 University of Kansas (KU) Center for Teaching Excellence Award, the KU College of Liberal Arts and Sciences 2009 John C. Wright Graduate Mentor Award, and the 2012 Kansas Board of Regents' Haguchi/Irvin E. Youngberg Research Achievement Award. The Geological Society of America recognized his achievements with two prestigious awards: the George Rapp Award for outstanding contributions to the interdisciplinary field of archaeological geology, and the 2010 Kirk Bryan Award for Excellence.

NEWS, VIEWS AND REVIEWS

ODDS 'N ENDS. People to know more about

Many familiar names have passed through our Midwest, and some are almost forgotten or overlooked. Examples are —

<u>Loren Eisely</u> (bn 1907 in Nebraska; d 1977); famous nature writer, educator, philosopher, BA English and BS Geology/Anthropology at KU. Taught at KU from 1937 - 1944. Author of *The Immense Journey* and *The Unexpected Universe*, etc. Gravestone inscription "We loved the earth but could not stay"

Aldo Leopold (bn 1906; d 1947); famous environmentalist, author of "The Sand County Almanac"; Associated with the U. of Missouri in 1930 on the Ashland Wildlife Research Area which was followed by a speech entitled "Natural History - The Forgotten Science".

Clyde Tombaugh (bn 1906; d 1997; astronomer, discovered Pluto, stated in a version of his bio "Not many undergraduates enter the University of Kansas having already achieved worldwide fame. And, to date, only one has entered KU after discovering a planet." In recognition of his achievements and in his honor, on Lindley Hall at KU was constructed the Tombaugh Observatory, which a few years ago was removed and given (actually the mirror is "on permanent loan") to a group who installed it west of Topeka. That group is the NE Amateur Astronomer's League (NEKAAL) and the site (known as the Farpoint Observatory) is on the grounds of the Mission Valley High School at Eskridge, KS. This site is just north of the Admire meteorite strewn field - and these meteorites have been featured by a vendor the last two years at the KC gem and mineral shows. (I knew Mr. Tombaugh and his family and can relate further information to those who might be interested in his life/career. Norm Onnen).
