Thumbnail Minerals

A recent supplement (Nov.-Dec., 2022) to "The Mineralogical Record" featured a comprehensive discussion and extensive examples of "thumbnail" collecting. The Introduction properly stated "It's About Attitude, Not Size" in describing the attraction of collecting, organizing and exhibiting thumbnails - - which are described as specimens which fit into a 1" cube. Citing the distraction of novice individuals collecting some of everything [don't all rockhounds do this, not recognizing the concept of "leaverites"?], the explanation for collecting thumbnails entails concentrating and focusing on specimen sizes that easily satisfy most hobbyists economic and space considerations, and of the specimens being unique and of normally undamaged. (The extended consideration of this would be "micro-mounts" which necessarily requires expensive magnification equipment, etc., not usually desirable for early collectors albeit having more perfect crystal specimens).

An OGMS member who has collected and displayed thumbnails (and won Rocky Mountain Federation awards for such) is Barbara Crompton, our noted rockhound, club Treasurer, and Philatelist [new word for some?]. She has displayed her thumbnail gem and mineral specimens, coupled with the respective stamps at the KC G&M show as well as at two Rocky Mountain Federation Congress meetings (in which she won first place awards). We will ask her to display this collection at one of our meetings in the near future.

For those interested, the following represent specimen size definitions (with diagonal dimension in parenthesis) -

Thumbnail	1 inch (1.732 inches; 4.4 cm)
Large (Perky) Thumbnail	1.25 inches (5.5 cm)
Small Miniature (Toenail)	1.5 inches (6.6 cm)
Miniatures	2 inches (8.8 cm)
Small Cabinet	~4 inches (17.3 cm)
Cabinet	5 inches (22 cm)
Large Cabinet (Museum)	over 5 inches (22 cm)

All are recognized by the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies with the exception of Large Cabinet and Toenail size which are categories of the Tucson Gem and Mineral Society).

In defense of a random, opportunistic collector, the late collector and primarily a micro-mount specialist Neal Yedlin apparently declared "I collect minerals, not sizes". End of story apparently!!! N Onnen
